NEW DELHI: The Delhi high court on Wednesday sought the Union government's stand on a plea for formulating a policy to give similar respect and "equally propagate" to the national song, Vande Mataram at par with the national anthem "Jana Gana Mana".

About A deating their lastice Vipin Sanghi and justice Sachin Data issued notice on the peti-tion by BJP leader and lawyer Ashwini Kimar Hyndhwy to the Delhi government National Council for Education Research and Training (NCERT) on the petition which has sought to ensure that "Jana Gana Mana" and Vande Mataram are played and sung in all ischools and edu-cational institutions on every working day.

The petitioner argued before the court that in the absence of any guideline or regulations to honour Vande Mataram, the mational song is being sung in an "uncivilised manner" and misued in films and parties. Even though the court took exception to the petitioner publicizing the matter in the press even before it came up for hearing, acting CI Sanghi said that he will entertain the present PIL because the petitioner is a serious litigam. "In order to keep the country united, it is the duty of the government to frame a national policy to promote propagate 'Jana

icy to promote-propagate "Jana Gana Mana" and "Vande Mata-Gana Mana" and "Vande Mata-ram". There is no reason why it should evoke any other senti-ment as the both are decided by Constitution makers," the peti-tion read. The matter would be heard on November 9.



The Delhi government has already announced a ban on SUP items in the Delhi secretariat from June 1.
